My Name is Antonio Galaviz and this constitutes my declaration of what I witnessed concerning Janet Phelan, with honesty to the best of my remembrance.

In 2014, Janet asked me to accompany her to a doctor's office and a chemist's lab as well. She said that both professionals had been involved in misconduct. We went to the doctor's office and met with the doctor, "Dr. Antonio" at Casa de Luz on Ninos Heroes in San Cristobal. Janet confronted him about his given misdiagnosis concerning her lung disease. He admitted that her lungs were very sick and also admitted that he didn't tell her this when she went to see him about her lungs. Janet was very upset while confronting him, she even cried at one point. I limited myself to observe these events. She asked him if he could, at least, refund her the cost of this misdiagnosis. He agreed to refund 700 pesos back to her.

On the way to the chemist's lab, "Laboratorio Pasteur" located at 28 - 16 de Septiembre in San Cristobal de las Casas, I was concerned with Janet's safety and that is part of the reason why I decided to go with her. She had 2 bottles of 500ml that contained medicine obtained at this lab, the only medicine that effectively helped Janet's lung disease. She claimed that one of the bottles caused her severe poisoning of a sort. At the lab, Janet placed the two bottles on the desk and confronted the chemist about this problem. The doctor said that the medicine was perfectly fine, grabbed one of the bottles and drank from it, as if all was fine with it. However, he did not pick up the other bottle to drink from it, he declined to do so. Janet claims that one of the stickers was higher/lower than the other one, which is the norm with home-made products in the region and would identify the difference between the bottles.
